Some Best Practices for Printing Best Practices Bookmarks

The pdfs have 0.5" margins, which is the minimum required by most printers.

- Don't forget – only send the second page to the printer to make your bookmark.
- Print these on salvaged (i.e. printed on one side already) paper or cardstock. I use holiday cards.
- Don't laminate these in plastic to make them last longer or protect them from coffee spills. Tuck these babies into a book 'til they're worn out and then print yourself a new one on plain old unadulterated paper again.
- Just cut them with scissors.
- Try implementing one of the practices.
- Share them.
